



Once upon a time there was a creature called Oo. Oo lived in an oak forest together with his friends Uu, Pah, Tuut and Crazy Owl: a young owl who is still learning how to fly. One day a wizard appears into Oo's home, and steals all Oo's books. This starts an adventure on land, in the sky, and under the water.

The idea of the game:

1. A child logs on to the game using a made up username (for example a tiger) on the desired character. There is room for three children on one device. Once the child has played the entire game, you can remove the name with the "x" icon. This way a new player can log in using their own username.
2. A child reads the sentences thoroughly. If possible, the sentences should be read out loud. The game is also possible to be played with headphones on, this helps the sound effects/ the music sound clearer.
3. The child fixes the mistakes in the sentences. All of the sentences don't have any mistakes. If a mistake is found, the reader taps the mistake, which fixes it. At the same time, a dark coin will appear, and the child has an opportunity to collect the coin from the next game.

4. Once the child succeeds to catch the coin from the game, it will appear in the bag, which is located in the right corner of the main menu. By tapping the bag you can see how many coins you have.
5. In Oo's life there are 13 small stories. There are eight mistakes so the child has eight opportunities to collect coins. Once all the coins have been collected, a solution window will open, which takes Oo to the missed books. If the child can't pick up a coin, they can read/fix/play the story again.
6. Without fixing the mistakes the child can still play the games, but can't collect the coins and thus can't find the solution. This means it's good to put emphasis on the reading part of the game so you can get to the solutions and get a fun reading diploma with some tasks. (Free to download at www.hihappening.com)

The idea is to get the child to play the reading game as independently as possible. The reading aspect isn't supposed to be controlled study material, but instead a fun way of strengthening the child's reading ability. All feedback is welcome.
